How to survey

- 1. Walk through each field in a random pattern, rating the degree of infestation for each weed species on your weed survey form. Either use a numeric scale of 1 to 5, or rate weed species as "light," "medium," or "heavy."
- 2. Indicate the growth stage of the weed on the form (for example, seedling or mature).
- 3. Check fencerows, ditch banks, field edges, and wet spots as these may be problem areas for weed growth.
- Check areas around the field edges, as these areas could be potential sources for wind-disseminated seeds.
